

Which areas are covered from Filey and Eastfield Police Stations?

There were 177 incidents reported in your area during October. Incidents of note are as follows: -

05/10/2024 02:23 – Officers on patrol near Musham Bank Roundabout stopped a vehicle which was being driven in an anti-social manner. The driver and vehicle were issued with a Sec.59 warning which means if they are seen driving in this manner again within the next 12 months, the vehicle will be seized and driver reported for road traffic offences.

07/10/2024 14:10 — A resident received an unsolicited WhatsApp message from a number previously unknown to them stating "Hi Mum, this is my new number I have been having really bad signal problems, this is my new number." The conversation has gone on to ask to borrow £1,890 until Wednesday. The money was not sent and then further calls were received from the scammer claiming to be a loan shark and things would not end well for their child if they didn't pay this money. The resident correctly identified this as a scam and did not suffer any monetary loss. Please do not engage with any unsolicited WhatsApp messages you receive, this is a well-known scam which unfortunately is occasionally still successful.

07/10/2024 23:09 — A motorbike was stolen from an address on Overdale. The victim tracked the bike to a location near the Dell which led Police to recover the bike a short while after it was stolen. The incident is under investigation, please report any information and quote incident 12240183187.

08/10/2024 15:47 – A female wanted by another Police force was located and arrested in Eastfield.

17/10/2024 15:16 – A grey/silver Benelli motor bike was stolen overnight from an address on Shield Way in Eastfield. The bike was recovered by Officers on 22/10/24 from where it had been abandoned near Eastfield. Please report any information and quote 12240189527.
