

Which areas are covered from Filey and Eastfield Police Stations?

The areas in blue and yellow – covered from Eastfield Police station. Areas in green – covered from Filey Police Station.



There were 163 incidents reported in your area during January. Incidents of note are as follows: -

09/01/2025 13:27 — Officers on patrol stopped a vehicle at Musham Bank roundabout. The driver had no insurance policy in place, so they were reported for this offence. The car was insured by the owner at the roadside prior to being let on their way by Police.

12/01/2025 11:20 – Three off-road motorbikes were seized from youths across the course of this day, they were being ridden in various parts of Eastfield. All three will be dealt with for driving offences and their parent reported to their housing associations for possible breach of tenancy. Thank you for everyone's support in reporting these incidents, but please continue to report them when you see them. In particular, descriptions of the bike, any colours, unique markings, where the bikes live etc...

12/01/2025 16:45 – Officers on patrol stop a vehicle on Dunslow Road. A learner driver was being supervised by someone who had only recently passed their test. This meant that they were not driving in accordance with their license.

15/01/2025 16:30 – An e-scooter was seized from a youth riding it illegally on Link Walk in Eastfield.

18/01/2025 10:13 – A vehicle failed to stop for Officers in Seamer and again on Cayton Low Road. It was located back at its home address a short while later. The male suspect was arrested for a variety of offences and later released pending further investigation.

20/01/2025 - 08:00 – Three local youths were arrested on suspicion of stealing motorbikes from Eastfield at the beginning of December. They were all interviewed and released on bail conditions including a curfew to their home addresses. The investigation into the theft of motorbikes will continue whilst they are on bail.

22/01/2025 08:00 — Drugs warrants were carried out at two addresses on Eastfield resulting in three people being arrested on suspicion of a drug supply offences. Drugs, an offensive weapon and a considerable amount of cash were recovered from the searches. Three males were later charged with various drug supply offences, possession of an offensive weapon and possession of criminal property (cash). One of them was remanded straight to court form Police cells and the other two were bailed to appear at court on a later date.

24/01/2025 15:43 – Officers on patrol on Westway stopped a vehicle. Enquiries revealed the driver did not have the correct license so the vehicle was seized and driver reported.

26/01/2025 20:27 – Several windows to a flat on Lowfield were smashed. Officers attended and called housing to board them up. The incident is under investigation, please report any information and quote 12250015764.

30/01/2025 10:48 – A resident on Hawthorn Walk posted on social media that their motor bike had been stolen the previous night at 2100hrs. Officers attended the address; the bike had been found dumped in the Dell. Enquiries are ongoing, please report any information and quote 12250018081.
